

1302. PHASELIS. DEDICATION TO ZEUS BOULAIOS, 2nd HALF OF THE 1st-EARLY 2nd CENT. A.D. Greyish-white marble circular altar with dowel hole in its top; around the top of the drum a frieze of bucrania and rosettes with a projecting profile below and a four-part lower profile. Found in Building A 15 on the acropolis ridge, SSW of the theatre; apparently reused for building purposes. The relief seems to belong to the 2nd or even the 3rd cent. B.C., but the inscription could be as late as the date indicated in the heading of this lemma. Ed. pr. D.J. Blackman, in: Phaselis 143-144 no. 1 (ph.).

On p. 144 ed. pr. comments on Zeus Boulaios; he considers it tempting to see in this inscription a further record of the visit to Phaselis by Hadrian, "if the lettering permits such a late dating". For Ἀδριανὸς Βουλαῖος ed. pr. refers to IG V 1 1352.
